Stanley A. Mr. Camhi received his Juris Doctor degree in 1975 from the Emory University School of Law, where he graduated with distinction and was awarded the Order of the Coif based upon his academic achievements. Upon graduation he was admitted to practice law in Georgia. In 1976, he was admitted to practice law in both the District of Columbia and Virginia. In 1980, he was also admitted to practice in New York. In addition to being a member of the bar of each of these states, Mr. Camhi is admitted to practice law in the respective federal district courts where he has tried numerous cases.
